Editor's Annual Report of Journal of the Association of Physicians of India

On behalf of all my esteemed colleagues of the Editorial Board, I take great pleasure in presenting to you the annual report of the activities of the Journal of the Association of Physicians of India during the period 1st January to 31st December 2020.

The journal has received 415 articles during the year 2022 (i.e. 1st January 2022 to 31st December 2022). We have published 89 Original Articles, 14 Review Articles, 15 Case Reports, 12 Pictorial CME's, and 51 Correspondences.

From June issue onwards we started a JAPI with new look and new format. Annual Report of Director Physicians Research Foundation (PRF)

My sincere thanks to my mentor DrY P Munjal and to the President of API Dr Shyam Sundar for the unconditional support they have extended to the PRF throughout the year due to which we have been able to continue the good work done by my predecessors Dr Siddharth Shah and DrY P Munjal. Some of the ongoing activities of PRF have been as follows. I will like to place on record the able help provided to me by Dr Rajinder Bansal, Joint Secretary PRF and all the honourable members of the physician research foundation. They have actively guided and participated in all the activities innumerated below.

- 1. The API PRF journal club has become popular across the country. We have had sessions by PGI Chandigarh, DMC Ludhiana, KPC Medical College, Kolkata, Stanley medical college, Chennai, SMS Jaipur, PGIMS Rohtak, Lady Hardinge Medical College, Delhi and AIIMS New Delhi. I request you all to please tell me who all will like to be a mentor and which institution wants to do the next presentation. All presentations and articles that have been discussed till now are available on the website as a repository.
- 2. The STEMI Management Centre Course was done in the months of July to September 2022. 600 doctors from across the country participated in the course. This was done in association with Emcure. They have given 15 lack rupees to PRF for this course. This money will be used for clinical trials and given to postgraduate students as per the protocols laid in the PRF meeting.
- 3. Dr Muruganathan had given 35 lacks for an award to be given in his father's name 'Arumugam Research Award' for research in rural area. We will start giving the award of 70,000 (the interest on the parent amount) from this year. The award committee will include all the members of the PRF. The award will be given for a research project of excellence in rural area.
- 4. Retrospective National Mucormycosis Registry is ongoing and we have collected data from 5 medical institutions. This will be the first Cohort study under the aegis of API. I ardently request all the members of the governing body and faculty council to recruit as many centres as possible from across the country so that we have maximum number of cases in this study. We will have a few publications from the data. All those who contribute cases will be made



authors for the publications. This will be possible only with the support of all of you. This is the beginning and will be followed by other multi centric studies.

5. We have a wish to form the **API PRF Ethics Committee**. The legal and logistic issues in its formation are being given consideration. Hopefully we will share the progress that we make in this direction, if we do so, by the next meeting.

Any other suggestions by the Honourable members of the API and ICP are welcome. Thanking you.
