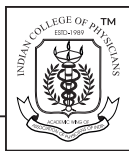
Minutes of the 35th Annual General Body meeting of Indian College of Physicians

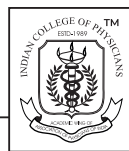
5. **To consider the 35th Annual Report of the ICP.**

The 35th Annual report of ICP read by Dr. Jyotirmoy Pal The Indian College of Physicians has striven to upgrade medical education and standard of care since the last 3 decades and it is my sacred duty as Dean ICP to fulfil this aim to the best of my ability. The expansion of API/ICP is happening at a great pace and increase in the membership has seen a new high in the country. I will summarize the key developments within the last few months in brief for this august gathering.

1. ICP website and Newsletter

The new website bearing all information about the fellows, the activities and events of the ICP is a success. Its key feature, the online application form for Fellowship has been used with enthusiasm and has decreased many hassles.

Three issues of the Newsletter, every 3 months, highlighting the publications, latest programs and achievements of API /ICP members has been published – Jan-



April, May-Aug , Sept – Dec has been greatly appreciated . The Jan to March issue is also underway .

2. Global Forum –

The Global forum meeting was held in Bangladesh in 20-21 st May 2023 and was attended by

President API Dr Girish Mathur . The Global Meetings in Srilanka on 2,3 rd November 2023 and in Nepal 30 TH ,1 ST December 2023 were greatly successful. As per those meetings, a Global Summit Session will be presented on 22.2.24 at the Jeevak Hall where speakers from Srilanka Nepal, Bangladesh will be giving their lectures.

3. Meetings with Royal College Glasgow

The last virtual meeting of Indian College of Physicians and Royal College of Physicians Glasgow happened on 13.10.23 .

The primary agenda of the meeting was to discuss a collaboration of ICP, that is the academic wing of Association of Physicians of India with the Royal College of Physicians and embark on a joint venture of academic activities .

Decision was taken to hold a set of four webinars jointly where speakers from both the organizations will take part . A yearlong calendar/ time table of events was chalked out with two speakers in each of the webinar representing ICP and RCP speaking on a common topic .

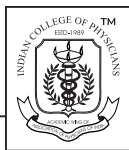
5.All India Quiz Contest

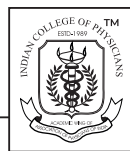

Apart from office maintenance a larger amount of funds need to be allocated for the smooth functioning and expansion of ICP activities .

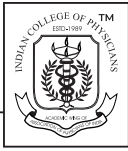

All the Fellows congratulated the new team.

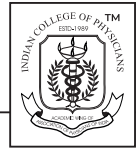

ICP Dean took office on 22.02.2024 at New Delhi. Some Important key activities organized under the banner of ICP for 2024-2025 are as follows:

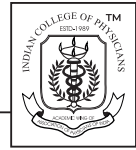
