

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of **THE ASSOCIATION OF PHYSICIANS OF INDIA**, (herein after referred as "the Society") which comprise the Statement of Assets and Liabilities as at 31st March, 2024, and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and notes to financial statements.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the financial statements read with significant accounting policies and notes give the information required by the Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 (herein after referred as the Act) in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- a) In case of Statement of Affairs, of the state of affairs of the Society as at 31st March, 2024; and
- b) In case of Income and Expenditure Account, of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence.
